Other News

World Handicap System Implementation

A few members have been asking questions about the World Handicap System (WHS) due to be implemented in January 2020. **Ian Heathcock** has prepared a briefing note on what it is and when we can expect it.

Your handicap will be based on the best eight of your last 20 rounds. The automatic increase of 0.1 shots per round after a poor round will no longer take place, nor will there be a buffer zone. The Competition Scratch Score (CSS) for a round will also disappear.

Competitive and recreational rounds of 9 or 18 holes will count towards handicaps so we may be able to have the same handicap in use for Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

The maximum handicap allowed will be 54.

Our existing CONGU handicaps will be used to generate the new average handicap.

We will need to submit 20 cards every two years to retain our handicaps.

For handicap calculation purposes the new system will use the same maximum nett double bogey score for any hole.

The slope rating will mean that when you play a more challenging course than Boldmere, you will get extra shots on your handicap. Conversely, if you play an easier course you will lose shots from your handicap.

All rounds will need to be pre registered (to stop golfers not handing in cards which would reduce their handicap).

Annual handicap reviews will still apply as they do now.

The system was originally going to be implemented worldwide by Jan 2020, but Great Britain and Ireland will not be ready until November 2020 at the earliest, because all courses will have to be *slope* rated for all tee options (white yellow and red at Boldmere). This will provide a uniform assessment of all courses degree of difficulty.

Handicap software suppliers will have to create new software to manage the new system, all of which will need to be fully tested before introduction. The Shaggy Dogs will need to liaise with the main club to see if we can use the same system.
