Rules corner



lan Heathcock of the Handicap Committee explains how Shaggies can ensure they comply with the rules when the "Ball is accidentally moved" in different parts of the course.

Rule 9 Fairway and Rough, Ball moved when taking a practice swing. If you take a practice swing and accidentally move your ball in doing so, this does not count as a stroke, and you must put the ball back with

one penalty stroke. If you do not put it back, you will incur two penalty strokes for playing from the wrong spot.

Rule 13 On the Green, Ball accidentally moved. If you accidentally cause your ball to move (eg when grounding your club or as a result of a practice swing too close to the ball), no penalty is incurred on the green by way of exception. The ball must be put back on its original spot.

Rule 6 Ball falls off the tee. If the ball is accidentally knocked from the tee before you tee off (e.g. when grounding the club or because of a practice swing too close to the ball), this does not count as a stroke. There is no penalty and you can tee the ball up again.
