Practicing on the Course

MytimeActive have advised us that that the old 18th green and fairway is not a practice area and that the green is being used as a nursery for supporting other greens. The defined practice area is the old 17th hole on the far side of the car park. Members are advised of rule 5.2b. On the day of a stroke-play (includes stableford, Par Bogey etc.) competition:

- A player must not practise on the course before a round, **except** that the player may:
 - o Practise putting or chipping on or near their first teeing area.
 - o Practise on any practice area.
 - Practise on or near the putting green of the hole just completed even if they will play that hole again on the same day

This rule does not apply to Match Play competitions.
